### **HOW IT ALL STARTED - Cathy W4CMG**

Some people are born into Amateur Radio, but just don't realize it right away! My grandfather had a "Radio Room" on the top floor of his 3-story home, and I got to look – and not touch – when I was a kid. It was pretty cool, listening to his "secret code". I thought he must be some sort of a spy. When he became a silent key, I was busy doing the other life stuff – kids, work, etc. – and had no interest in any of the things he had accumulated over the years. Do I wish things had been different!

Fast forward MANY years, to when Jim WA4VGZ and I got married, and I had no idea he was a ham or why anyone would want to be one. A few years after we moved to Nashville from CT in 2007, Jim renewed his interest in ham radio. Something about hearing his callsign over – and over – and over again - made me head for the other room! Then, toward the end of 2011, I went with him to the OHX SKYWARN Appreciation Day, saw what Amateur Radio could be, and earned my Technician, General and Amateur Extra Licenses in 2012 (KK4IWN). I changed to W4CMG (initials in my callsign) in 2017.

I love challenges, so contesting was a great way for me to become active. I gradually recognized that many of the top scorers in TCG were CW operators, and in 2017, I started to learn CW. Work and family circumstances gave me some starts and stops, until I developed renewed enthusiasm for CW when I retired in 2020. My "little pistol" station includes a Yaesu FT-991A that I run at 100 Watts for contests, and 5 Watts



for some fun QRP activities. Jim and I share a G5RV up about 35 feet. Soon to be installed – a Hy-Gain 6-band vertical that will be mounted to a 45-foot mast! Can't wait for the extra height! Waiting for the heat to break before we start the installation.

I operate CW only – no microphone on my rig! I am on the air daily for several different activities. I upload daily to ClubLog, LoTW and QRZ Logbook. I love CW Contesting and can be found on the air participating in major contests and State QSO parties (in support of the State QSO Party Challenge). The scores still can't compete with bigger stations, so I compete with myself – with a goal to beat the previous year's scores, and where practical, to double them. THAT gets harder each year (3)

I am involved in several clubs and groups in addition to the Tennessee Contest Group, including CWops, Long Island CW Club (Instructor: Essential Operating Subjects and Kids Classes), SKCC (Vice President, Board Member, Straight Key Sprint Manager), NAQCC and more! I was honored recently to become a member of the First Class C.W. Operators Club (FOC).

I enjoy QRP activities and participate in QRP Foxhunts, operating as a 40M, 80M and 20M "Fox" twice per "season," as well as being a "hound" in the weekly QRP fox hunts. I also support the Nashville Office of Emergency Management by performing ham radio equipment checks during a monthly state-wide test.

When I am not on the air, I am supporting the American Red Cross as the National Headquarters Humanitarian Services Project Management Competency Team Lead, the TN Region Disaster Action Team Lead and several local Nashville Area Chapter Responsibilities. Local responsibilities often include dispatching teams to home fires and other local disasters, so if you hear me on the air in the middle of the night, I may be playing on the radio to stay awake while waiting for my team to report on their status.

I would like to thank Jim, WA4VGZ, for his patience as I continue to practice and take over our antenna whenever there is a CW event on the calendar (and in between). A deep thanks to Kirk, K4RO, Jim AD4EB, Ted, W3TB and many others who provide inspiration, guidance, support, and goals to meet, and to Robert (aka Pete) WM4Q, who was my first ever CW contact, and who continues to challenge me in some "healthy competition" (3)
