There have been very few problems noted with groups.io, and I am happy to report considerably less work for the list manager. Users have adapted quickly, and have customized settings to their liking. Please note that we can also use the groups.io platform to share files, build simple databases, and conduct polls. We will explore more of these capabilities in the coming months.

The K4TCG.ORG web site has been receiving some upgrades. The site is now a little bit easier to navigate. We've added a few pages, including the latest Silent Key document. Thanks to those who provided material for the SK page. Any corrections or additional information should be sent directly to K4RO. CW Sprint - September 14th 0000 to 0359 UTC (logs due 7 days later)

Please make a note of this date as the CW Sprint is usually held during the first Saturday/Sunday UTC time. Due to a conflict with another very popular CW contest, it is now scheduled for the second Saturday evening which is September 14th 0000 - 0400 UTC.

Be sure your log was uploaded by checking the Logs Received web page at https://ncjweb.com/cwsprintlogs/.)

Conditions look reasonably good for a contest on 80, 40, and 20 meters. 20 should be pretty good for at least a couple of hours, with 40 taking off around 0100 so you have a good shot at working our VE1, VE9, VO1/2, VY1, and VY2 friends. Later in the contest, KH6, KL7 and maybe VY1/VE8 will make an appearance.

Do you know someone who hasn't been on for the Sprint in a while or maybe have never given it a try at all? This is probably the easiest way to pep up the contest and make another Sprinter along the way. If we all just recruit one more station...

For the September CW Sprint we are going to add some contest club stats. This will be club stats which are separate from the five man sprint teams. Should be some interesting things to see with this listing.

How I Got Started in Ham Radio

My first interest in radio was sparked by the launch of Sputnik in 1957. I was hoping to hear the beeps coming from outer space, but unfortunately, the BC-348-N WW2 surplus receiver my father had purchased on Radio Row in NYC only went up to 18 MHz (kilocycles at the time) and Sputnik was transmitting near WWV on 20 MHz. As an eight year old interested in space and science, I was very disappointed. However, that receiver eventually was used for listening to shortwave AM broadcasters like Radio Moscow, Voice of America, HCJB ("The Voice of the Andes") and many others. I still have the QSL cards from that era.

In 1960 my family moved from Brooklyn to New Jersey, giving me the opportunity to experiment with longer wire antennas. The thrill of hearing signals from distant places all around the globe really resonated with me, and that set me on the goal of DXing when I finally did get my Novice ticket in 1965. I practiced Morse Code with my friend Larry Gray who became WN2RUD (now sadly SK), and when I was ready to take the Novice test my father brought me to Radio Row for the test to be administered by Sy Denby, W2BNW (SK), the proprietor of Niagara Radio Supply (https://hamgallery.com/Tribute/W2BNW/). I took my test in the back room of his shop on Greenwich Street, now long gone after the construction of the World Trade Center. As a teenager I did not fully appreciate what a classic opportunity that was. It provided me a tenuous connection to the thread of ham radio going back many decades. Sy's tribute page even includes an advertisement for the BC-348 receiver (\$45.50, a princely sum at that time). That receiver now sits in my shop waiting to be restored to operational condition.



It took weeks for the FCC to mail my license, and I was issued WN2REE. Using the BC-348-N and a homebrew 6146A (yes, 6146A....later upgraded to 6146B for more power) transmitter constructed from the pages of the ARRL Handbook, I eagerly began transmitting with 75 watts input power crystal control on 80m and 40m CW. I had only two crystals for each band. I filled out logbook pages of fruitless CQs and calls to other stations, as required by FCC regulations back then. Finally, one morning before school I managed a contact all the way to Schenectady, NY, and I was overjoyed. My on-air ham radio career had begun.
